

1991 Where were you on July 15, 1991? It's not a date most of you will remember, but I do. It was my first day as an official staff member of Campus Crusade for Christ.

For my 15th anniversary with Campus Crusade, I thought I'd share some of my memories.

Through many of you, God raised my support in about 4 months, and I moved to Florida in December.

In those days, I had a mainframe terminal at my desk. About the only thing that's the same at my current desk is the cans of Pepsi (and they've changed color).

The early-to-mid 90's are a blur. My main job was keeping the mainframe running and up-to-date, but I was also involved in communications from the start. Originally there were modems so that people could dial into the office with what we called "dumb terminals". As the office moved to personal computers, we kept on installing new kinds of systems for people to dial into when they were at home or traveling.

Soon we put in headquarters' first Internet connection. That's been keeping me busy ever since!

1998 A wonderful year! Liesl and I were married.

1999 We turned off the mainframe on my birthday, March 31! Just in time, because there was no room for it at the Lake Hart campus, where we were headed in April (about 12 miles from Sunport, the original Orlando headquarters location). Since I was not part of the move from California in 1991, this was my first big office move. God blessed that effort, and there were very few problems for a move of that magnitude.

2000 We hosted the FinTech conference, a conference in Orlando for Campus Crusade's financial and technology people from around the US. I got to teach a class about computer networks.

2001 Such a year of contrasts! Anja was born, and then 9/11 happened. God really touched people's hearts through the *Fallen But Not Forgotten* booklets.

2003 This was our first summer as a part of the Conference Team at CCC's biannual training in Colorado. Dr. Bright passed away, and we celebrated how much God accomplished through his life.

2004 The Ups: 30th anniversary of Computer Services.
The Downs: Hurricane Charley. A few of us were just reminiscing about how good it was that the hurricane came on a Friday — we had the whole weekend to dig out from under the trees before we had to try to get the office running again!

2005 New opportunities for service: the whole family traveled to Budapest, Hungary to help with the Eastern Europe Staff Conference. Then we had our second opportunity to spend a summer in Colorado on the Conference Team.

2006 The DaVinci Code brings opportunities for ministry, and opportunities for me to learn what happens when a web site gets more popular than you're ready for (if you don't know that story, read about it at www.kranich.org). Since 1991, headquarters has grown from supporting a few personal computers and no Internet connection to a thousand computers and tens of thousands of emails per day.

As I look back over the past 15 years, I'm amazed at how God has blessed the ministry of Campus Crusade for Christ, and how He has blessed us through you. Thank you so much for partnering with us to fulfill the Great Commission!
